

Guess what? Our Youth Group ROCKS! They are an enthusiastic, accepting, faithful, and respectful youth group – they inspire the adults who interact with them, and they make friends with other youth. I could not be prouder. <u>Our focus in October at</u> <u>TUMC is on the harvest that the Lord has planted and cultivated in</u> <u>our lives.</u> His harvest is ripening in powerful ways in the lives of our children and youth at TUMC. Wasn't Rally Day wonderful? 30 children and youth were at Sunday School for our kick-off.
